The National Navy UDT-SEAL Museum is the only museum dedicated solely to preserving the history and heritage of the Navy SEALs and their predecessors. Located in Fort Pierce, Florida, the birthplace of the Navy Frogman—and coming soon to San Diego, California—the Museum promotes public education by providing the opportunity to explore the history of Naval Special Warfare.

We honor our fallen on the black granite walls of the Navy SEAL Memorial, while caring for our families through the Trident House Charities Program. This includes the Trident House, the Scholarship Program, the K9 Project, Family Support initiatives, and Capital Projects that support our Mission.

Built to honor the men who served with fortitude and dedication, the Navy SEAL Museum first opened its doors on Veterans Day in 1985. From humble beginnings, the Museum has experienced tremendous growth, achieving national designation in 2007.
